

PROGRESSION POLICY

Progression policy is to make students understand the eligibility criteria to progress to the next academic year. The policy will be in effect from 2024 admission batch onwards.

1. An academic year consists of odd semesters (I, III, V & VII), even semesters (II, IV, VI & VIII), make-up examination after the end of odd / even semester, supplementary examination (odd semester backlog courses in next higher odd semester & even semester backlog courses in next higher even semester) and summer semester at the end of the even semester. In the case of 5-year integrated B.A. LL.B./ B.B.A. LL.B./ or any other 5-year integrated M.A./ M.Sc./ M.Tech./ M.B.A. programme, semester IX and X will also be applicable.
2. The evaluation is divided into CIE-Continuous Internal Evaluation and SEE- Semester End Evaluation. The ratio of CIE and SEE shall be as prescribed in regulation no. 2 of Examination Policy.
3. Progression is applicable to students who have obtained pass and above grades (P, C, B, B+, A, A+, O as explained in the table 1 of Grades and Grading Policy) and Failed(F)/Absent(AB)/ Shortage of Attendance(SA)/ Failed in Internals(FI) in any course of odd or even semester of that academic year.
4. A student having CIE and/or SEE backlogs (F/AB/SA/FI) in the odd semester will be allowed to register for all the courses of the even semester.
5. In the even semester, the student should focus only on the courses offered in the even semester of that academic year.

The following conditions apply for the promotion to the next academic year.

- i. Students without any backlogs in any of the odd and even semester of the current academic year will be promoted to the next academic year.
- ii. A student with a minimum 80% credits earned¹ from all registered courses in the previous academic year is eligible to be promoted to the next academic year.

¹ In case of calculated credits with decimal value, it shall be rounded off to the lower integer value.

Illustration:

- a) If the total registered credits are 48, then 80% of 48 credits is 38.4. Hence, the minimum credits required to be promoted will be considered as 38.
- b) If the total registered credits are 46, then 80% of 46 credits is 36.8. Hence, the minimum credits required to be promoted will be considered as 36.



6. A student having earned less than 80% of the course credits from all registered courses in the previous academic year, has to re-register for the backlog courses as per re-registration policy.

7. In the make-up exam, a student can take the examination for the courses with I grade as per the instructions of the academic advisory committee as mentioned below:

Grade 'I' can be awarded to a student having satisfactory attendance and meeting the passing standard at CIE in a course but remained absent from SEE for valid and convincing reasons acceptable to the University, as per the Examination Policy.

8. In the summer semester, a student will register for courses as per the instructions of the academic advisory committee as mentioned below:

- i. The students with SA/FI grades can register for not more than 12 credits or 4 courses whichever is less, for the instruction classes of summer semester.
- ii. A student must attend instruction sessions in summer semester only for courses where SA / FI grades were obtained and must meet the attendance and CIE requirements as applicable in the regular semester.
- iii. A student having the minimum required attendance and has fully completed CIE requirements in a course but has obtained having failed (F) or absent (AB) grades, need not undergo the instruction sessions and can directly register for the SEE during the summer semester.

9. After the results of summer semester, if the student has not earned 80% of the total credits in the current academic year, then the student will be not promoted to the next academic year and will be detained. The student has to re-register for the failed courses and the coursework will be taken up by the as per the re-registration policy.

10. The student not promoted to the next academic year will have to re-register as per the re-registration policy, by paying 40% of the tuition fees as prescribed by the University.

- i. The re-registered student is required to adhere to the attendance policy for each of the courses registered and complete the CIE requirements as instructed by the respective course faculty.
- ii. On successful completion of the CIE and meeting the attendance requirements, the student will be eligible to appear for SEE of the course/s in the same odd/even semester.
- iii. The re-registered students who do not successfully complete the backlog courses in odd/even semester, shall follow the process of registering for the summer semester as per section 8.







11. A student seeking registration for the 3rd semester (second year) should have successfully completed all courses and earned 80% of the total credits of 1st and 2nd semester put together.
12. A student seeking registration for 5th semester (third year) should have successfully completed all courses of 1st year and earned 80% of the total credits of 3rd and 4th semester put together.
13. A student seeking registration for the 7th semester (fourth year) should have successfully completed all courses of 1st & 2nd year and earned 80% of the total credits of 5th and 6th semester put together.
14. A student seeking registration for the 9th semester (fifth year, in case of integrated programme) should have successfully completed all courses of 1st, 2nd and 3rd year and earned 80% of the total credits of 7th and 8th semester put together.
15. Only when the detained student re-registers, they will become eligible to attend classes, take up the CIE and attend SEE for the backlog courses.

Note:

The students are allowed to attend the current academic year classes until the 'Not Promoted' list of the previous academic year is published. If they are not promoted to the current academic year, they must comply with the re-registration policy.


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
